

As producing oil and gas fields mature, operators may seek opportunities to enhance the recovery of hydrocarbons from those fields. Oftentimes, enhanced recovery comes in the form of waterfloods or other forms of injection, which may necessarily drive hydrocarbons and other fluids across property lines. This type of operation touches on various property rights, including surface rights, mineral rights, correlative rights, and contractual rights under the affected lease agreements, joint operating agreements and other agreements. Unitization is the prudent way of executing and implementing these projects while protecting the rights of stakeholders, and unitization can be compelled under Kansas statutes. This presentation explores the land and legal implications of unitization for enhanced recovery purposes and describes how to effectively execute these projects.

- sion of the original application and contract to KIOGA, shall be irrevocable, except as set forth in Paragraph 5, below, and all exhibit space rental fees shall be paid with the submission of this application and contract.
- This contract may be cancelled by either party without penalty on or before Jun by giving notice in writing to the other.
