The Kansas Geological Survey is one of the oldest and most well-respected agencies in Kansas and one of the most celebrated geology research institutions in the United States. Through much of its 160-year history, the Survey has focused on surficial geologic mapping, delineation of fossil assemblages, and mineral assays. Although these classical geological studies are still incredibly relevant to the economic development of our state (perhaps more so now than ever before), the modern survey also conducts cutting-edge research in a range of fields from energy to water, 911 response, human health, and even homeland security. The Survey's 130 scientists and staff have a service mission focusing on surficial and subsurface natural resources of economic importance. No assets are more important than energy resources and water, and the KGS is rapidly building its efforts to continue impacting both vital sectors.

In this presentation, Dr. Jay Kalbas will bring national and regional perspectives on applied research, service, and education while introducing new KGS initiatives.

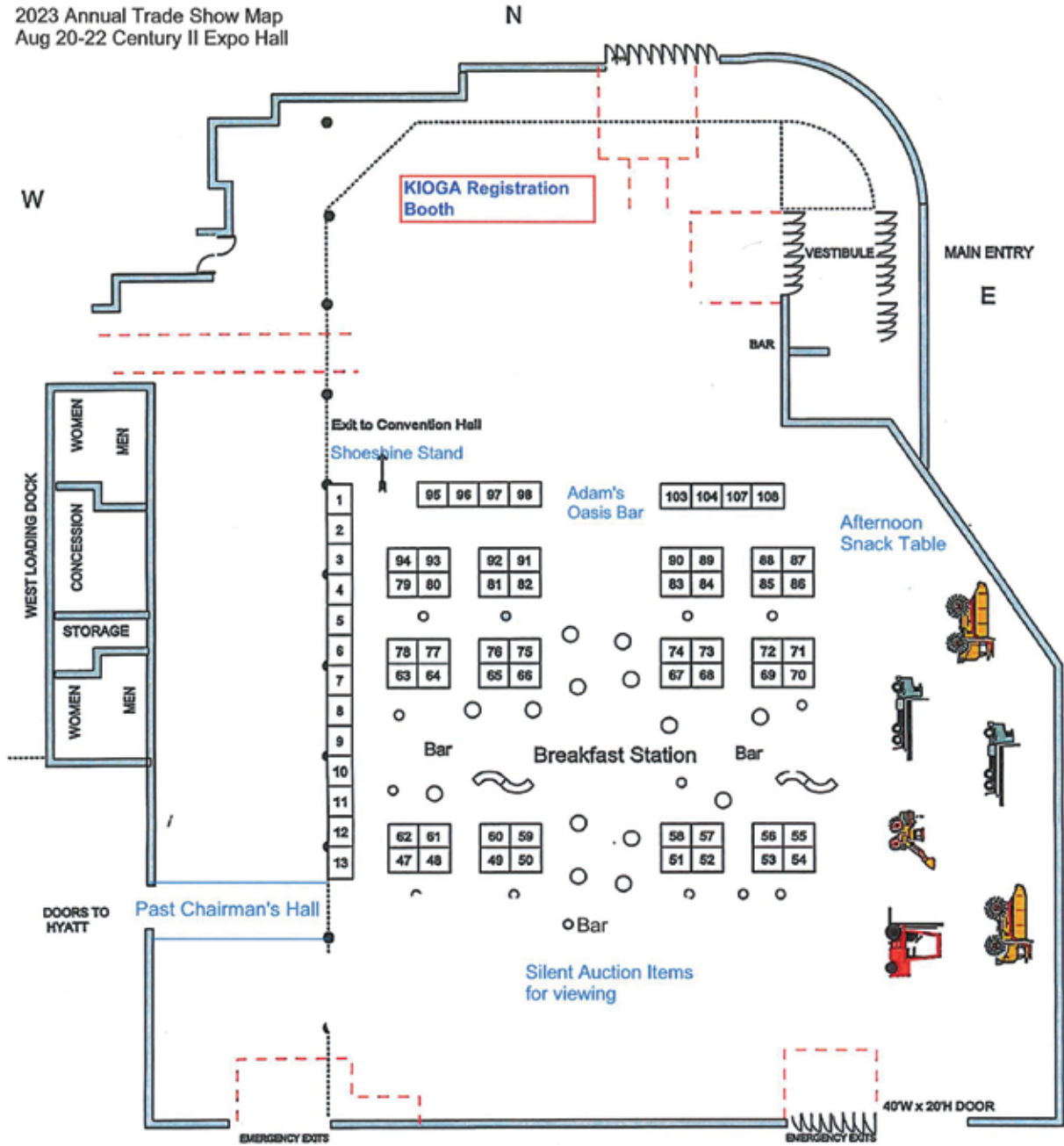

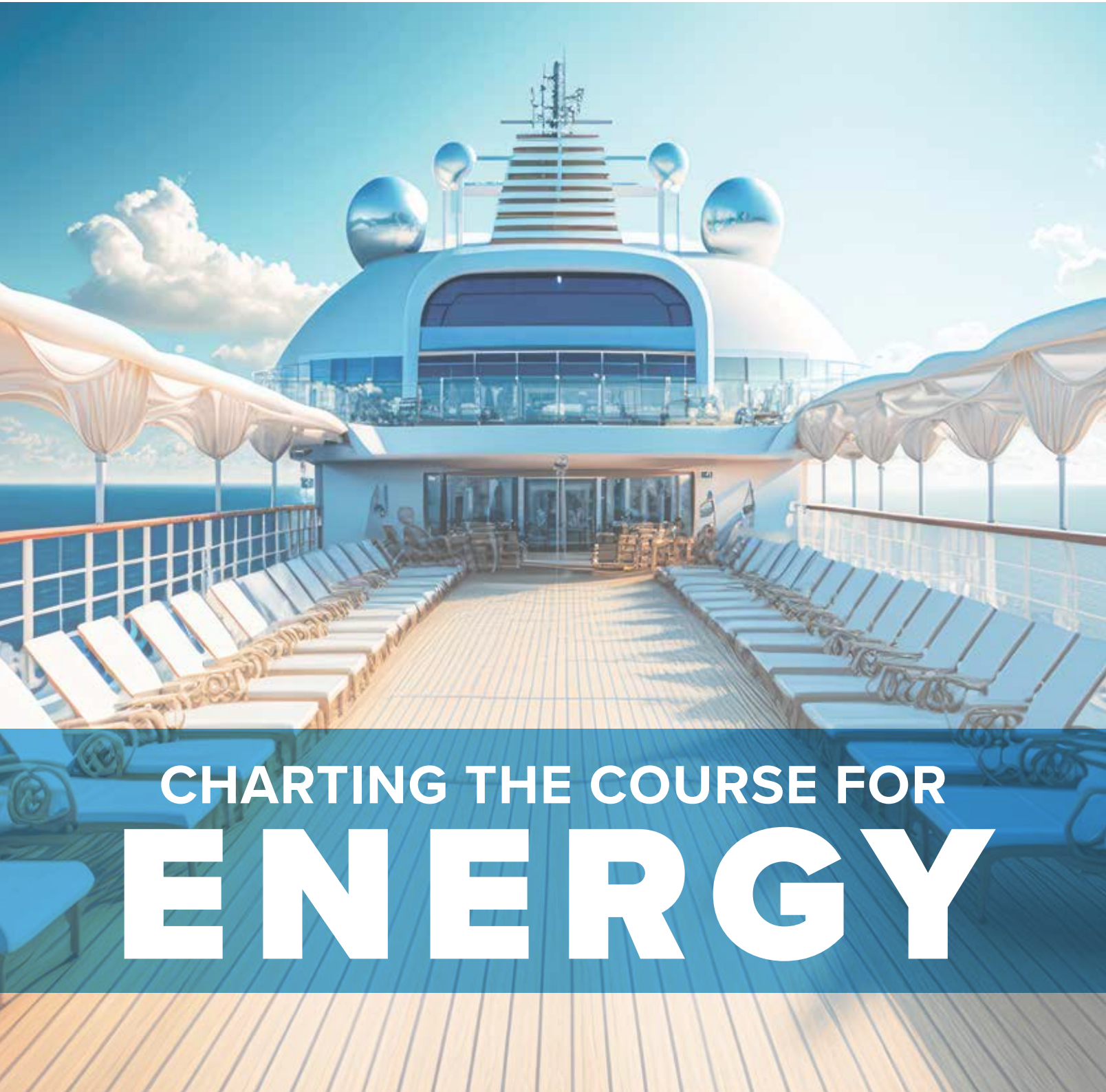
